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District Making Plans for Summer

Valley Center Schools is busy making plans for the rapidly-approaching summer. We will be offering summer driver's education, high school credit recovery, a camp style program for K-6 students, and a program that assists students with building important skills.

Summer driver's education enrollment runs March 27-31 for current VCHS students. Enrollment information packets will be available in the counselor's offices beginning March 6. Current VCMS students can enroll from April 1-5. If space is still available, open enrollment for students not attending VC schools begins April 8. Our website has all the details for the program. Dates for the first session: May 30-June 19. The second session runs June 20-July 12. To enroll, students must have proof of a valid Learner's Permit by May 1, 2017. The entire enrollment packet must be filled out upon enrollment. A payment by check or cash in the amount of \$175 is also due upon enrollment.

High school credit recovery will also be available this summer. Typically, there is a session early in the summer as well as one a bit later in July. Students are allowed to enroll in one class each session. More details will be available mid-March.

Last year, our younger students took advantage of a new summer camp type program. This program allows students to enroll in classes a week at a time, so vacations and camps don't have to be missed. Some of the classes last year included cooking, art, and technology. The camps will begin in June and meet Mondays through Thursdays from 8:00 – 12:00. Students can take four classes a week if they like. Look for more details in a month or so.

We will also hold our classes for students who could benefit from little extra help and practice. Teachers will be discussing this option with parents if they believe their student might benefit. This program also takes place Mondays through Thursdays from 8:00-12:00 in June.

As usual, many of our middle and high school activities will also have a variety events this summer. Look for more information on them a little closer to May.

We are also excited to announce our free summer meal program will be back. This program allows children through age 18 to have free breakfast and lunches. It's a great opportunity for our community, and we are happy it is back for another summer.

All summer plans will begin to be distributed over the next several weeks. The district and school websites are great places to find the most up-to-date information on all our activities.
